




## HIGH HOLIDAY RECIPE

### ROASTED POMEGRANATE AND SAGE CHICKEN

Serves 4; can be doubled

1 whole chicken, cut in 1/8's  
2 tablespoons olive oil  
4 garlic cloves, minced  
1 teaspoon kosher salt  
1/4 cup fresh sage, finely chopped, plus extra leaves for stuffing or 3 teaspoons dried sage  
16 ounces (2 cups) pure pomegranate juice  
1 cup chicken broth  
1 teaspoon black pepper  
2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar  
2 tablespoons brown sugar  
Pomegranate seeds for garnish  
Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

In a small bowl, mix olive oil with garlic, sage and salt.

Rub mixture evenly, all over chicken, making sure to get most of it under the skin.

Place chicken in a small roasting pan or baking dish. Add broth and 2 tablespoons pomegranate juice into the bottom of the roasting pan. Roast for about 1 hour to 1 hour and 15 minutes, basting chicken with the juices from the bottom of the pan every 30 minutes.

While chicken is roasting, pour remaining pomegranate juice in a small saucepan. Stir in pepper, balsamic vinegar and sugar and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium, and simmer until juice is reduced to a syrup, about 15-20 minutes. Remove chicken from oven and pour 3/4 of the glaze over the chicken. If the glaze has hardened, heat it over low heat until fluid. Pour remaining glaze over chicken, just before serving, and garnish with pomegranate seeds.




**APPLE PROJECT RETURNS**

by Michael Oren.**



New York Times bestselling author Michael Oren served as the Israeli ambassador to the United States from 2009 to 2013. Dr. Oren is an American by birth and a historian by training. He has had an illustrious career as a Middle scholar, and the Jerusalem Post listed him as one of the world's most influential Jews. He is a member of the Knesset.

In his newest book, ALLY, Ambassador Oren recounts arriving at his diplomatic post just as Benjamin Netanyahu, Barack Obama, and Hillary Clinton assumed office. During his tenure in office, Israel and America grappled with the Palestinian peace process, the Arab Spring, and existential threats to Israel posed by international terrorism and the Iranian nuclear program. *The Federation office has a copy of this book in the office that is available for loan to Federation members.*■
