EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

THE JEWISH FEDERATIONS OF NORTH AMERICA RESPONDS IN TIMES OF TROUBLE



The Jewish Federations of North America held their annual meeting for Executive Directors of Small and Medium Sized Federations in Houston, Texas this past February. It was an opportunity for the Directors to see up close and personal the ways that JFNA reaches out to communities that have experienced trauma such as Houston experienced in Hurricane Harvey.

Upon arriving, we had the opportunity to go to the community food bank to assemble bags of food designed to feed a family of four that will go home in school backpacks to over 18,000 families. The Houston Food Bank is the largest in the United States and as a result of the devastation from the hurricane, the need for food is 30 times greater than before the hurricane.

Houston is one of the largest Jewish communities in North America. Unfortunately, the majority of its institutions, agencies and Jewish homes were hit by the hurricane. We visited the massive Jewish Community Center, located in a highly Jewish area. The lower level of the JCC which housed a pre-school, offices, exercise classes, art studios, an outdoor playground, and a variety of common spaces was completely destroyed.

At this time, it is uncertain whether the JCC can afford to rebuild the devastated area as the leadership is very concerned about possible future flooding.

Our Federation joined in the effort to raise \$14 million of the \$30 estimated that Houston needs to rebuild. Approximately \$5.3 million was provided from JFNA to aid displaced families.

Grants and loans were issued to help rebuild homes that are structurally sound enough to be rebuilt. Emergency cash, transportation, clothing, food, and housing were granted to those in need. Temporary camps were opened to provide beds and a safe environment for children. JFNA granted \$3.4 million to three of the largest synagogues, all of which suffered horrendous damage. Another \$800,000 was granted to provide trauma support, as many families have experienced 2-3 floods in the last few years and require therapy to deal with their losses. The Houston Community knows that it will take many years to recover fully from the damage of Hurricane Harvey, but they are determined to rebuild their lives and their city.



JFNA was also called upon to respond to assist after the shootings at the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Broward County, Florida. With support from the Israeli government, the Israel Trauma Coalition brought in a team to work with the city, schools, and clergy in the area. The Broward County Federation opened up a satellite office of its Jewish family services for the community to use.

Houston and Broward County are just two of the examples of the daily work JFNA does. Thanks to its donors, the Federation system is able to respond quickly and effectively when called upon. They make change happen not only in the Jewish world, but in the greater world. If you haven't made your pledge yet, please do so today. Help us make a positive difference in our world. WHAT WE SUPPORT

Yad Sarah

HISTORY: [Yad Sarah](#) is the largest national volunteer organization in Israel. With more than 6,000 volunteers and a salaried staff of 150, Yad Sarah serves more than 350,000 clients each year. It is best known for its free loans of over 244,000 pieces of medical and rehabilitative home-care equipment annually, enabling sick, disabled, elderly and recuperating patients to live at home. This saves the country's economy an estimated \$320 million in

hospital fees and long-term care costs each year.

Yad Sarah started in the 1970s as a *gemach* (free-loan service) in the home of **Rabbi Uri Lupolianski**, who later served as mayor of Jerusalem from 2003 to 2008. Lupolianski incorporated his *gemach* into a nationwide non-profit in 1976. Lupolianski named the organization *Yad Sarah* (Hebrew for "Memorial to Sarah") in memory of his grandmother, Sarah, who had died in the Holocaust. Yad Sarah raises 92% of its operating budget from donations. The organization does not receive any government assistance. Yad Sarah has helped establish equipment-lending centers and repair workshops in Angola, Cameroon, El Salvador, Russia, South Africa, and Jordan.

EQUIPMENT LENDING: Yad Sarah lends out wheelchairs, crutches, oxygen concentrators, apnea monitors, infant scales, hospital beds, shower chairs and commodes, high-tech and assistive devices, and many other home-care items. At any given time, 18,000 wheelchairs are in circulation. Equipment loans are free of charge; borrowers leave a refundable security deposit and can use the equipment for up to three months.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES: Yad Sarah lends oxygen purifying machines and oxygen cylinders for home use. The organization is reimbursed for this service by Israel's National Insurance Institute (Bituah Leumi) and the patient's health insurer.



Yad Sarah uses specially equipped vans to transport persons in wheelchairs to doctor's appointments, Yad Sarah center activities, social occasions, or errands. These vans also bring

disabled individuals to and from polling places on Election Day. Yad Sarah provides airport pick up and return for disabled tourists as well.

In addition to its transportation division, Yad Sarah provides services for the homebound, including Meals on Wheels, laundry services, home repairs and general home visits to individuals to engage them in handicrafts, computer instruction, taping and typing of life stories, and wheelchair outings.

They have experienced volunteers such as lawyers, social workers and legal and social work students who volunteer their expertise to draft wills, mediate property and landlord issues, mediate family disputes, advise on insurance rights and pensions and advocate in cases of elder abuse, all at a low cost. This service, overseen by Yad Riva which the auspices of Yad Sarah, makes house calls.

Yad Sarah has a dental clinic which is one of the few in the world specializing in geriatric dentistry.

Yad Sarah operates Day Rehabilitation Centers in Jerusalem, Rishon LeZion, Ra'anana and Netanya. These centers, designed to help adults and children recover and restore independent functioning, offer activities such as art therapy, music, horticulture and holiday parties.



In addition to the above services and activities, it has a "**Golden Age Club**" which is an education and recreation resource for retirees. Volunteers lead classes in language studies, arts, crafts, folk dancing and Tai Chi, as well as offer podiatry, manicure, pedicure and reflexology. Participants can purchase discount tickets to theaters, concerts and exhibitions.

It is an organization that we can all be very proud of and perhaps copy some of its ideas and programs into our community.

AMERICANS AND THE HOLOCAUST FOCUS OF KEYNOTE

[Dr. Rebecca Erbelding](#), the keynote speaker at a six-day Symposium next month to educate tomorrow's teachers about the Holocaust, will discuss "Americans and the Holocaust" on Wednesday, May 16 at 7 p.m. at the Temple in a program open to the public.

A historian, curator, and archivist for 15 years at the [United States Holocaust Memorial Museum](#), Dr. Erbelding is currently a historian for the USHMM's exhibition that opened in April on *Americans and the Holocaust* and author of *Rescue Board: The Untold Story of America's Efforts to Save the Jews of Europe*. She holds a PhD in American history from George Mason University.

Her speech will look at questions that include "What did Americans know about the Nazi persecution and murder of European Jews, and what did they do about it?" New research shows us that Nazism and the persecution of the Jews was widely covered in the American media, and Americans had a variety of reactions to the information— from indifference to active rescue efforts.

Dr. Erbelding will examine the motives, pressures, and fears that shaped Americans' responses to Nazism, the refugee crisis, war, and the genocide in Europe during the 1930s and 1940s.

Her visit is part of the second [Holocaust symposium](#) sponsored by The Temple's Holocaust Education Committee and [IPFW's Institute for Holocaust and Genocide Studies](#) on May 13-18 on the IPFW campus for pre-service teachers interested in learning more about teaching the Holocaust and genocide. On Yom Ha'atzmaut, Israel's Independence Day (April 19), Israelis pack their picnic baskets and have a BBQ.

Matbucha -- Moroccan Tomato and Pepper Salad

6 medium ripe tomatoes, cored and chopped into 1-inch pieces

4-6 cloves garlic, peeled and finely chopped

1 small green jalapeño pepper, seeded and diced OR 2 medium green bell peppers, chopped

1/3 cup oil (canola or olive)

2 tablespoons paprika

1 1/2 teaspoons kosher or sea salt

1/2 to 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Place the tomatoes, garlic, and peppers in a heavy-bottomed 3-quart saucepan. Set over medium heat and cook, uncovered, for 20 minutes, stirring frequently with a spoon.

When the vegetables are nice and soft, add the oil, paprika, salt, and pepper. Cook, stirring frequently, for another 10 minutes.

When the mixture is well blended and most of the liquid has evaporated, the matbucha is ready.

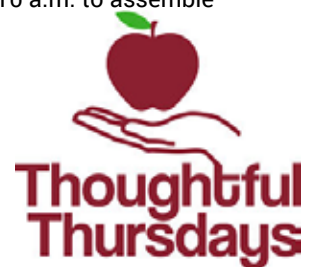
Cool and store in a covered container in the refrigerator.

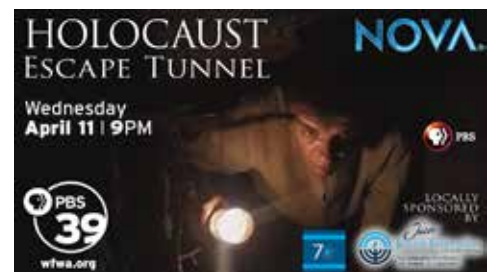
