# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - JAKI SCHREIER'S ANNUAL MEETING SPEECH



Shalom and good evening. Welcome to the 97th Annual Meeting for the Jewish Federation of Fort Wayne.

Our mission continues.....

And quoting our Mission Statement, "We support the well-being and continuity of the Jewish people in greater Fort Wayne, in Israel, and throughout the world". ..... We have our work cut out for us.

Reflecting on our shared values, the Federation shall, thus.....

- \* Foster continuity and growth while seeking to preserve and strengthen Jewish life.
- \* Study, plan, and provide for the present and future, social education, cultural and welfare needs of the local Jewish community.
- \* Support Israel as well as American and World Jewry.
- \* Raise, allocate, and disburse the resources needed to meet the Federation's goals and responsibilities.
- \* Foster, support, and safeguard religious freedom and civil rights.

My personal gratitude and heartfelt appreciation go out for all the hard work and commitment of the Federation's small staff and for our very active Board and Committees. We work daily to live up to our mission.

I am very proud to represent the Jewish Federation of Fort Wayne. I find it hard to believe that it has been five years since you honored me with the position of Executive Director. As I reflect on this period and the challenges we face as a community and a people, I remain optimistic, but also concerned.

While the Jewish people share many things in common, we are upended by divisions that impede our central task of building a strong, cohesive community. We recognize the need to engage Jews of all backgrounds and especially our young people, ... in our sacred work and the joys of our traditions. Yes, differences of opinion are healthy and help us to learn more about our complex problems and how to reach real solutions. If we stop listening to each other and caring about one another, it is then that I get truly concerned.

..... I remain optimistic, ..... because so many of the lay leaders of our community and the members of Federation, whom I've had the honor to work with these past years, represent the best of what Jewish principles represent. In order to ensure a vibrant Jewish future for our children and grandchildren, all of us need to remain committed to making sure that we preserve these core values. To me, these virtues are based upon an understanding that each and every one of us has a responsibility to one another and to the world at large, and to continue to repair the world consistent with the moral code of our Torah. Remembering the lesson of the great teacher Rabbi Hillel who, when asked to explain the meaning of the Torah, said "What is hateful to you, do not do to your neighbor. Everything else is commentary. Go now and study it."

My hope for all of us, as we look to the future, is that we work harder to hear and understand one another.

We have survived and made a significant difference in bettering this world for well over 3,000 years, .... because of our common values and traditions. This is also what now propels us to continue to do the sacred work of caring for people in need right here in Fort Wayne and all over the world.

The Federation continues to be a positive voice in our community. For a small Jewish community and a small Federation, we keep a busy schedule.

Watch for new, innovative, and carefully planned programming. To list a few such as: ...

The **Israel@70** commemoration, the miracle that is Israel, with most of the yearlong events being open to the public. We will celebrate how Israel went from a fledgling new nation to one that brings hope and resources to other countries in need ... showing the world that a vibrant democracy and Jewish values breeds success.

We owe a great deal to the committee members of **People of the Book, Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Education, Rosh Chodesh, and Israel@70** for their brilliantly executed programming during this past year.

The **Partnership 2-Gether** Committee is organizing a major event for October 2018, where Muslim, Christian, Druze, and Jewish women from the Western Galilee will speak on their lives, their friendships, and how they co-exist in peace. This is a wonderful opportunity to show a true side of Israel not seen in the media. In spring 2019, representatives of the non-profit organization ... Merkaz Maaseh, will visit our community. The purpose of their visit will be to present a positive image of Israel that focuses on building peaceful co-existence.

We're continuing to expand the visits and delivery of holiday and get-well Shabbat gift bags to the members of the Jewish community.

We anticipate another banner year at **Camp Joe Levine**, due in part to scholarships made available from the Dr. Harry Salon Foundation and the Janet Finkel Scholarship Fund for children who may not be able to experience a fun, outdoor camping adventure.

**PJ Library** will be expanding to the ACPL and community schools with a program titled "**The Journey That Saved Curious George**" - the true wartime escape of Margret and H.A. Rey.

In October, we will partner with Heartland Sings for programming with PJ Library author, musician, storyteller, and poet, Leslea Newman.

"**Violins of Hope**" a program spearheaded by the Fort Wayne Philharmonic and the Jewish Federation. This project will feature 27 violins rescued from the Holocaust. These violins will be played by violinists from the PHIL and the Youth Symphony. We anticipate that "Violins of Hope" will bring together many local non-profit agencies as partners.

The JFFW and our **Community Relations Council** continue to speak out on the malignant growth of anti-Semitism, which we see right here in Fort Wayne and around the world. We will continue to be a strong voice and remain vigilant against the perverse and fixated bias directed at Israel, the virulent attacks against Judaism as a religion, and the calls for the destruction of the State of Israel.

We welcome former Federation Director Ben Eisbart as the incoming President. We thank Ron Friedman for an extraordinary three years.

The Federation continues to thrive due to the incredible leadership of Dr. Ron Friedman and our amazing Board of Directors, volunteers, committee members, the Dr. Harry Salon Foundation, the Dr. Louis and Anne B. Schneider Foundation, our rabbis, and each and every one of you who work hard to show your support. Words cannot begin to express the J.F.F.W.'s appreciation!
